E. FINANCE DIVISION

E1. Review, discussion, and possible approval for the purchase of a water truck for the Reno Sparks <u>Livestock Events Center from Custom Truck One Source in the amount not to exceed Eighty-Two</u> Thousand Dollars (\$82,000).

Charles Harris, CEO, presented the bid from Custom Truck One Source for the purchase of a water truck at the Reno-Livestock Events Center (RSLEC). He stated that the current vehicle is inoperable, and the replacement will improve daily dust control, improve footing in all dirt areas, enhance the cleaning of asphalt areas, and allow for improvements in watering livestock. He went on to say that staff received three quotes in accordance with the RSCVA purchasing policy, and all quotes were given full consideration. He said that the vehicle is expected to last up to 20-years and remain at the Livestock Events Center, keeping the mileage low. Mr. Harris recommended purchasing the water truck from Custom Truck One Source, the bidder with the lowest cost, for a total price of \$82,000.

Councilwoman Charlene Bybee asked if this vehicle was built into the budget.

Charles Harris stated that the water truck is included in the budget, and Trent LaFerriere and Jose Martinez have been working diligently to find a vehicle that came in 20% under budget.

Member Ann Silver asked if the current vehicle could be sold.

Trent LaFerriere stated that staff would put the current vehicle out to TNT Auctions.

<u>MOTION</u>: Commissioner Bob Lucey made a motion to approve the purchase of the water truck from Custom Truck One Source for an amount not to exceed Eighty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$82,000). It was seconded by member Mark Sterbens. <u>Motion carried unanimously.</u>

Chair Hillary Schieve joined the board meeting at 11:37 am.
